Just Back from 35 Days in Guyana, South America

The 2024 annual World Evangelism Guyana, South America Nationwide Workshops are history now. Our series of eight workshops began on February 3rd and concluded on February 29th. In addition, I taught or preached at two other congregations. Between the workshops and the Bible classes and sermons for those churches, I spoke 21 times.



Guyanese preachers on our team taught a combined 32 workshop lessons besides teaching and preaching on Lord's Days at their respective congregations. The primary team this year consisted of brethren Nigel Milo, Feroze Baksh and me; two more brethren, Cy Walker and Floyd Cato, presented lessons, too. Numerous congregations (52) and hundreds of brethren (827) attended throughout the country over the course of the month. Brethren enthusiastically welcomed our program at each venue, and we believe we achieved our purpose to encourage, edify and equip our Guyanese brothers and sisters in Christ. Lord willing and at the request of congregations and individual Christians, we're already looking forward to 2025.

As our team traveled by car, bus, boat and small plane, we distributed thousands of copies of *The Voice of Truth International* magazines, tracts and Christian books. Christians and non-Christians also have a seemingly insatiable appetite for *VOTI*. Thousands can be handed personally to the public on the streets of Georgetown, for instance, in a matter of a few hours. It was my good pleasure while in Guyana this year to serve as a messenger for the Wildwood Church of Christ toward a preacher and the church he serves.

Urgent!

There is an **urgent** matter, however, that I cannot ignore indefinitely. My first foreign mission trip many years ago and this most recent one to Guyana have something in common, unfortunately. Way back then, we went abroad on borrowed money and continued raising funds for that trip upon our return – not a comfortable way to go about things, but nevertheless, trusting that we had made the better choice. We did it again this time, too! We still lack fund-

Furthermore, next month the annual fee of nearly \$6,000 is due for the weekly television program by brother Nigel Milo from a powerful station in Georgetown, Guyana, South America. The broadcast reaches most of Guyana and beyond. It's a bargain at that price, but only if we can continue to fund it. Perhaps you're interested in this type of mass evangelism and can help.

Louis left for Guyana on January 30 from the Orlando International Airport (MCO). He returned on March 4.

I am having problems with my back and legs. Therefore, I am not able to walk as I did a few years ago. I am sorry I could not go, but I did my best taking care of the home front. I had Flossy to take care of me (our little 12-pound Cavapoo). I hope my back will get better so I can go next year. I really miss the work and the Chrisian friends I have made over the years.

I promised Louis I would try to have most of the house spring cleaning done before he returned, as well as have the Christmas decorations sorted into crates and put into the shed. My biggest project besides the Christmas ordeal was our bedroom, which likewise is Flossy's bedroom, my office and the site of a few ongoing sewing projects. Also, I told him I would have Flossy housetrained. With the help of two friends from church and my granddaughter Kaylynn, everything was accomplished, to my surprise (especially having Flossy going outside to potty all the time)!

Thank you, Kaylynn, Esther and Myrna for all your help.

Kaylynn stayed with Flossy and me for the whole time Louis was away. She was the reason for the success of Flossy being housetrained. She worked with her every day, all day long. I worked with her late at night and in the morning until Kaylynn got up. We really had a good time, and our relationship grew. Kaylynn is a sweet young lady. We took a few days and did no work at all, and some days we even ran around, shopping and eating out. It was so nice the whole time my sweet husband was gone not to be alone. Flossy and I would have gone stir crazy.

Kaylynn was so attached to Flossy that she cried when it was time for her to go home. So, when she and her dad came over Sunday afternoon to get some things that I wanted to give him and get the rest of her belongings,









I let her take Flossy home for a little while. I still had a few things I wanted to get done before it was time to leave for the air-

port the next day. I even took a short nap.

On our way to the airport (Flossy and me), I took the wrong exit and ended up in downtown Orlando. Not a problem; I just followed the GPS to the airport, this time, the right way. Then, when Louis called me, we were in the cellphone lot. I was so excited talking a mile a minute to my four-legged girl that I made a wrong exit again. I went back around and did it right the second time. Louis was at the curb waiting and looking so handsome with a big smile.

I went ahead and drove home because I knew Flossy would go nuts, and he would have a rough time driving. Boy, oh boy, was I right! Louis got in the car, and she went wild. She jumped out of the seat and started licking the side of his face, his ears and his forehead. She was so excited to see her daddy. Yes, she is our 4-legged daughter (cf., 2 Samuel 12:3). She is a very special member of our family.

I am grateful for the Internet. While Louis was away, we would do a videochat when there was a strong enough Wi-fi connection. We would usually talk two to four times a day unless he had no Internet. This did not happen very often.

Well, as you all know, going on mission trips to foreign countries does take a lot of financing.

My first husband Bob, who has been deceased for eight years, had a saying. He would say, "There are two kinds of missionaries, there are the givers and the takers." We depend on the brethren and congregations to support this work, as we are the takers, and you are all the givers. Mission work is impossible without both. This is a great opportunity to do your part of mission work for our Lord.

We facilitate funds for television programs in both India and Guyana (South America), as well as money for follow-up Christian literature, Bibles, postage, etc. The foreign brethren with whom we labor for our God in Heaven are also dependent on your financial participation with us. We also covet your prayers for our continued ability to keep doing the Lord's work in foreign fields and stateside, too.

I thank you in advance for your support. It doesn't matter if it is \$5.00, \$5,000.00 or \$500,000.00. It is all the Lord's work, and the church will grow numerically and spiritually because of your backing.


