As team members in World Evangelism, we have the potential of contributing to the salvation of many thousands of souls and the edification of many more Christians around the globe. This 45-year-old evangelistic effort has grown over the decades to include (1) an international Gospel magazine (*Voice of Truth International*) consisting of a printing from 30,000 to 70,000 each quarter, (2) 36 foreign radio and 8 foreign TV programs, (3) 9 overseas Bible schools, (4) a monthly Internet Gospel magazine read all over the planet (www.gospelgazette.com), (5) numerous campaigns abroad annually, (6) massive literature distribution in Asia and Africa, and (7) plans to publish a new Bible school curriculum, written by brothers and sisters in Christ, which curriculum majors in (a) application to our times and (b) emphasis on the identity and exclusivity of the church over which Jesus Christ is Head and for which he will one day return to take back with him to Heaven.

As one of only two couples in Winona, MS at the World Evangelism building, Bonnie and I are chest-high deep in the various publishing aspects of this ministry, daily correspondence and communication worldwide, fundraising among our brethren and even facilities maintenance, etc. On February 5, 2008, less than a week ago as I write this, we buried the beloved J.C. Choate, but the work goes on, as he wanted it to progress after his departure. However, in order

I recently had the pleasure of listening to Sister Sue Crabtree at a Ladies' program sponsored by the Winona church of Christ in Winona, MS. Sister Crabtree presented her lesson, "Ladies Leading Ladies." Her presentation was divided in two segments. The first segment discussed the three basic learning types, with an emphasis on incorporating all three aspects into our presentations as we teach. The second segment discussed the importance of reaching out to the lost around us. The material was presented in an informative, entertaining manner. During the lesson, Sister Crabtree made the statement, "Phebe taught many the Gospel by delivering Paul's letter to the church at Rome." The Bible records Phebe's name only once (Romans 16:1-2). The Bible does not mention the names of any to whom Phebe taught the Gospel. Romans 16:1 states that Phebe was "a servant of the church at Cenchrea" and that she helped many including Paul. Yet, Phebe taught many the Gospel by delivering the Roman letter. All who study Romans 6:1-14 learn that baptism is a burial; once baptized we are a new creature and have a hope of a new life with Christ. Yes, Phebe is still teaching many long after she delivered Paul's letter to the church at Rome.

Just as Phebe taught many without meeting them, you can teach the Gospel of Christ to others without meeting them face-to-face. When you send tracts, you are teaching lost souls who read those tracts. When you financially support missionaries, you are teaching lost souls through the efforts of the missionaries. Just a few dollars a month, combined with several others who contribute a few dollars a month, will enable a missionary to reach out to lost souls across the world. Those who are currently contributing to our support are teaching lost souls they may never meet as we print and mail books across the country and around the world. When we make trips oversees to teach, you will have a part in the teaching as well. You have a part in teaching souls in countries we as Americans cannot visit through Gospel Gazette Online. We and all who we influence with the Gospel thank you for your continued financial and moral support.

Attending the Ladies' program at Winona was just one of the many activities in which we have been involved this month. We have traveled to Huntsville, AL; Louisville, MS; Marshall, AR and Center Ridge, AR. To each of the congregations and the members, we thank you for the kind hospitality shown.

Eventually, I will succeed in learning the program and be of better assistance to Betty in getting the publications to the printer. I am also trying to learn Microsoft Access, the program used to print labels for mailing *Voice of Truth International* and the Choate newsletter. Fortunately, Dennis Larsen came to Winona for a few days to fine-tune the database and give some handson instructions. Hopefully, future mailings will be completed with a little less frustration and a be little less time consuming. At least, we are striving toward that goal.

We have printed flyers, envelopes and stationary, reprinted our daughter's book, *What Makes Us Tick*, and we are beginning to reprint 2000 copies of *Beverage Alcohol*. In the near future, we will reprint one or more titles of books currently published through World Evangelism.

We have appointments scheduled for the next several weekends in Alabama and plan on attended the FHU lectureship the first week of February. As usual, we feel we are behind in all that we try to do. As one young Christian once said, "We can rest when we arrive in Heaven."
