# Telegu and Burmese Editions of "Living Principles"

Bonnie's book, Living Principles: Gleanings from Unnamed and Named Bible Characters, has been translated into the Telegu language of India and into the Burmese language of Myanmar. Through the generosity of readers of the Rushmore Newsletter, the Telegu edition has already been printed, and it is being distributed now. The Burmese edition will be printed soon.

When Bonnie and I go abroad, her presentations to ladies are especially sought, and they are well attended. It is not uncommon for 300 women to swarm around her and listen for up to four hours as she teaches them from God's Word. Bonnie provides a service as we travel together that is not often apart of the missionary travels, frequently engaged by Christian brothers unaccompanied by their wives. Together, Bonnie and I nearly double the teaching time that otherwise I could accomplish by myself.

In all societies, women occupy an important role in the home and even indirectly in the church, which far exceeds the typical devotion of teaching time and edification designed for them. Bonnie fulfills an important function overseas through both her oral lessons and her writing. I am proud of her and thankful to you for making it possible for her to be of service abroad for the cause of Christ in person and through her writing.

Bonnie is amending my class books on Ruth and Esther to include special, present day application lessons for students of those two

books. Other pressing matters are delaying progress on this, but eventually we will publish this study in one volume. My class book, The Church Divine, needs to be translated into one or more Indian languages and into one or more languages of Myanmar. I taught these lessons last year in both of those countries as well as in additional countries. The book was of special interest to Christian preachers in northeastern Myanmar, as I taught them about the identity of the Lord's church - including how to worship God acceptably. These men expressed a desire for my book to be translated into the Lisu language for use in their churches. The Lisu language spans the international border between Myanmar and China. I have great hope that these people and the congregations that they serve can be led completely to Jesus Christ.

Other titles of books that I have written await funds to bring them to print in English, and as needed in other languages as well. They include, *The Cost of Discipleship*, a commentary on the *Book of James*, *The Spirit Summarized*, two volumes on *Restoration History* and 10 sermon outline books, *Preaching the Whole Counsel of God*. Recently, I wrote a book for consumption in India; it refutes a heretical book that is dividing churches of Christ in that nation. I have completed the first chapter of a book entitled, *Converting the Church of Christ to Christ*. It will note the apathetic and indifference often exhibited by members of the church in western civilization, and it will

Sunday, Louis preached for the Main St. Church of Christ in Monroe City, the Central church in Vincennes and the Washington Street Church of Christ in Washington.

One Sunday found us close to home where we visited the Coffeeville, MS Church of Christ and the Hillcrest Church of Christ in Baldwyn, MS. All the congregations we visit make us feel welcome with encouraging words and offers of prayers. Most Wednesday nights, we gather with the saints at the West President congregation in Greenwood, MS, where I am enjoying teaching the first and second grade Bible Class.

May 9-12 found us in Hamilton, AL at Maywood Christian Camp for the annual Maywood Missionary Retreat. Louis and I along with a handful of others arrived on Wednesday to clean and prepare the camp for guests from across the country and locations outside the US. Thursday afternoon and Friday, we were privileged to hear biblical lessons from missionaries along with reports about the wonderful works conducted throughout the world. Saturday morning, we cleaned up the camp a little, before we dispersed to our appointments elsewhere. These few days are exhausting for those of us who host this program, but the rewards far outweigh the long, weary days.

The Winona office was honored with two groups of individuals who came to assist with bulk mailings and packing books for overseas distribution. The Booneville, MS Church of Christ brought a busload of workers (25) for a few hours. They prepared Betty Choate's newsletter, assembled Paula Bates' flashlight giveaways for when she went abroad next, packed boxes of books for overseas preachers, inventoried thousands of books, restocked tract supply

racks and book supply racks from which we pull to fulfill requests daily. We all unloaded seven pallets of books from a tractor-trailer and put them away in the warehouse. Altogether, they and we handled about 20,000 books – within an hour's time! They were able to accomplish all they did within four hours!

The second group consisted of Ruth Orr, Jane George (from TN), Prissy Sellers, Hope Stringfield and her daughter Amelia (from Missouri). These ladies spent several days packing hundreds of boxes of books for distribution to the Philippines, Nigeria, Ghana and Malawi. A few weeks later, we loaded three pallets of books onto the back of a tractor-trailer headed for the east coast where they will be placed in containers for shipment around the world. Eventually, preachers, church leaders, Christians and those seeking the Truth will give shouts of joy at the arrival of a small box of books they can claim as their very own, which will help them become better students of God's Word.

Of course, the day-to-day office duties continue to demand our attention – answering the phone, taking book orders, shipping book orders, preparing the next issue of *The Voice of Truth International*, *Gospel Gazette Online*, etc. There is always a long list of items that need our attention with never the possibility of being bored. It is just a matter of what demands our attention next or what do we feel like working on at the moment.

Now that spring has sprung, the grass demands mowing (a little extra exercise), and we have planted flowers in the front and back yards. With the backyard fenced in, Louis and I can steal a few moments in the morning or

### Passage Paid!

It's not as if I can say that I have the tickets in my hand. There are no tickets as such anymore. Instead, Bonnie and I have our airline itineraries with confirmation acknowledgements on them. We may not even need our itineraries this time since either our passports or our trip locator numbers tell the whole story of our impending journey to Guyana, South America and back.

We paid for the passage! Despite Delta advertising to the bitter end that it has economy tickets for a certain price, the airline never released the seats to correspond with the advertised prices. Consequently, we ended up paying hundreds of dollars more for our seats than the advertised prices. How is this not bait and switch?

We leave for Guyana on June 1<sup>st</sup>, but by a circuitous route, for sure. We board our first flight in Memphis, Tennessee for Atlanta, Georgia. We want to fly south, but we will be flying east! After a layover there, we fly from Atlanta to New York City. We want to fly south, but we will be flying north! After a layover in New York, we board a plane for a long flight to Georgetown, Guyana. Finally, we will be flying south! Leaving Friday, we arrive the next day. Booking our return flight was quite a challenge. Most of the return flights were scheduled to take up to 35 hours, with big layo-

ries of flights that compare favorably to the time invested traveling to Guyana.

### Funds Forthcoming

Even with short notice, several congregations and Christian families have responded already with funds to help us buy the airfare and attend to the other financial preparations. We thank God for each of you. Besides our air travel, money is needed for air travel of a national Guyanese brother who will participate with Bonnie and me in the seminars. Since we are traveling to various locations within Guyana, money must be spent on land travel for our group, too. In addition, at least two days during vers along the way. Eventually, we found a se-6these seminars, we will have to rent hotel

rooms for our little team of teachers. Of course, we'll have to eat occasionally also. Besides feeding ourselves, we will provide meals for the attendees of our seminars. There are always legitimate expenses that I never think of for which we will be responsible as well.

Many brethren and congregations routinely send workers to do outreach work in Guyana. We were a part of such an effort last summer as we traveled with brethren from the Collierville, TN Church of Christ. Some of the time spent then was also for edification of brethren. However, this year, Bonnie and I will concentrate our efforts on the edification of church leaders. We will be working primarily with preachers and their wives. Other interested church leaders and brethren are welcome, too. Bonnie and I specialize in teaching brethren to know God's Word more thoroughly and in equipping foreign brethren to evangelize their own nations more effectively.

We will be working with brother Nigel Milo, who has made arrangements ahead of time. He has divided the nation into five segments, and we will be traveling to those locations to conduct the seminars. Maybe next year, we will be able to schedule a seminar at a location to which the attendees can come. That, naturally, will be more expensive as we would compensate brethren for their travel expenses, need to lodge them and feed them. However, a central location permits more sessions; the teachers traveling cuts in on the number of classes that can be taught.

I will teach about the development of church leaders. A Guyanese brother will teach about the development of male leadership in the home. Bonnie will teach ladies about God's role for women in the home and in the church. Each seminar will conclude with a panel discussion, with male teachers fielding questions

from men and women in the audience.

While ongoing evangelism is certainly necessary, it is imperative to prepare foreign nationals to carry the load and responsibility for the stability of the church in their countries. Bonnie and I contribute to indigenous church

growth that releases foreign brethren from the perpetual dependence on foreigners that is often characteristic of foreign missions. Please pray for our efforts.
