



Stateside Travel

Since our return November 15, 2008 from India and Myanmar, Bonnie and I have traveled to several stateside congregations to apprise them about our mission trip abroad. Numerous photographs embedded in my PowerPoint presentation acquainted brothers and sisters with our movements through New Delhi and Bangalore, India; Yangon, Myanmar (Burma) and points in between, as well as our going to and coming from Asia. We hope that each of these brethren were as moved by the dedication of our foreign brethren and as joyful over the conversions as we are. For sure, our ministry as well as our lives would not be complete nor will they be complete in the future without foreign mission work. This is so, largely because of how much our brothers and sisters overseas appreciate and long for Gospel teaching and preaching. Bonnie and I left our hearts in Asia and can hardly wait to go back.

On November 30, 2008, Bonnie and I visited the **Old Union Church of Christ** (Carrolton, MS) in the morning and the **West President Church of Christ** (Greenwood, MS) Sunday evening, showing each congregation my PowerPoint presentation, "Same Planet, Different World." The following Wednesday night, I made my PowerPoint presentation to the **Winona (MS) Church of Christ**. Sunday, December 7, 2008, we worshipped with the **Flatwoods (KY) Church of Christ**, where for the Bible class I gave my Bible Archaeology PowerPoint lesson, and at the worship hour, I made my PowerPoint presentation about our mission trip. That Sunday evening, we worshipped with the **Sandyville (WV) Church of Christ** at which time I gave my presentation, "Same Planet, Different World," again.

Many hours away from Winona, MS, we often rely upon the hospitality of brethren to lodge and feed us along our nomadic path. For this we are always most grateful, but we were especially delighted while in Sandyville to spend time with Rodney and Julene Nulph and their two precious youngsters. Rodney is the Associate Editor for *Gospel Gazette Online (GGO)*, as well as the minister for the Sandyville congregation; Julene is a frequent writer for *GGO*.

Short on Sunday and Wednesday assembly days and passing through, we updated some dear brethren in Cameron, WV on Monday about our mission trip. We lodged overnight with Emanuel and Judy Daugherty in Bethlehem, WV; Emanuel and Judy are among some of our dearest friends and greatest encouragers, as well as supporters in our work.

This particular excursion northward was a working trip to visit our parents; we don't know what a true vacation is like! Again between assembly days, Bonnie and I visited my father, a widower, in Hadley, PA. Later that day, we visited Bonnie's mother, a widow, in Cambridge Springs, PA; we

were also able to meet for lunch with one of Bonnie's brothers, his wife and his daughter with her two young children (along with Bonnie's mother).

On Wednesday, December 10, 2008, we worshipped with the **Vermilion (OH) Church of Christ**, our sponsoring congregation. Following my PowerPoint, "Same Planet, Different World," I fielded questions about our foreign missionary work for about thirty minutes. We lodged overnight with Mark and Dawn Weaver and their children. Bonnie and I met the Weaver clan as he was a student and when I was an instructor at West Virginia School of Preaching; we have been the closest of friends ever since.

Sunday, December 14, 2008, we worshipped all day with the **Hanoverton (OH) Church of Christ**. I gave my "Bible Archaeology" PowerPoint lesson for Bible class, and I made my PowerPoint presentation about our mission trip at the worship hour. That evening I gave my PowerPoint lesson "Beverage Alcohol"; everywhere we traveled, we also gave away copies of my book, *Beverage Alcohol*.

Bob Noland is the minister for the Hanoverton congregation, and his wife, Martha, is Bonnie's best friend (besides me, of course!). They, too, are among our closest friends, encouragers and supporters; we lodged with them for a few days and hope they enjoyed the visit as much as we enjoyed it.

Having returned to Winona, MS, we launched out Wednesday, December 17 from there to Walls, MS; Bonnie and I spent hours in a public school where I showed my PowerPoint presentation of our foreign travel, and we displayed clothes, carvings, money, etc. from India, Myanmar and Thailand. That evening, we worshipped with the **Collierville (TN) Church of Christ** where our daughter is a working member, showing that congregation "Same Planet, Different World."

Sunday evening, December 21, 2008, we worshipped with the **Elliott (MS) Church of Christ**. We always feel at home at the Elliott congregation. Once more, I presented "Same Planet, Different World," but it never seems old even to me, and everyone seems to appreciate the combination of applicable Scriptures intermingled with pictures of our mission trip. The next Lord's day, we repeated the same scenario with the **Huntsville Church of Christ** at French Camp, MS. Many congregations we visit, like the Huntsville church, not only give us a warm, friendly welcome, but also enable our ministry financially through either occasional or

monthly support.

Throughout the weeks and months ahead, Bonnie and I will be visiting numerous congregations to either bring them an update on our mission work in which they have invested, or we will be visiting churches of Christ, hoping to persuade them to participate with us in world evangelism. I would that every person reading this newsletter had the same degree of interest in souls at home and abroad as we do. One of the most important things that you can do is to have the congregation of which you are a member invite Bonnie and me to come. If you are too far away from Bonnie and me to permit us to come to your congregation, please persuade your church to help us financially to take the Gospel of Christ overseas; we can provide you audio/visual presentations on CD and literature that the congregation can review. Your prayers, moral support and financial assistance in any dollar amount will help us enact the Great Commission. 

Teacher's Activity Bag

Not every Christian can go overseas to teach others about God. Financial and family responsibilities, personality makeup and physical capacities hinder some from making trips beyond one's home environment. However, we still have the responsibility to take the Gospel to the whole world (Matthew 28:18-20). Some go and others assist those going with financial and moral support.

God expects all Christians to serve Him with the abilities and opportunities available to them (Matthew 25:15-30). Ephesians 4:11-15 teaches that each Christian has a responsibility to grow in Christ and has various responsibilities in service to God. Thus, we learn that every Christian has a job to do, but no Christian can do everything. We need to evaluate our talents and put those talents to work serving God.

On our recent trip to India and Myanmar, I became aware of a great need within the local congregations. The Christians there do not have the resources, and many times, they do not have the training, to teach children's Bible classes. Some missionaries have included lessons on how to teach a children's class in the Ladies' classes, but the resources to teach are not readily available.

To assist each lady willing to teach a children's class, it has been suggested that we encourage ladies'

classes, teen girls' classes or other groups looking for a service project, above what the local congregation is already doing, to prepare **Teacher Activity Bags** for disbursement overseas.

Included in each bag:

1. A large Bible Story book
2. A Bible Story coloring book with simple pictures
3. A pack of thin paper for tracing pictures from the coloring book
4. A pack of crayons
5. Fine tip markers
6. Simple children's Bible songs that teach a lesson; type on paper and if possible record on cassette tape or CD-Rom
7. Bible Story flip charts (laminated) to teach the lessons
8. A typed list of items in the bag; include the titles and texts for lessons taught on the flip charts

All of the above items should be inserted into a large canvas tote bag for easy transport overseas and for use by the local sisters. When making the flip-charts, please remember that English is not the first language in India and Myanmar, and some of the ladies do not speak any English. Keep all wording short and simple and the pictures easily discernable.

On our next trip, I plan to prepare several lessons on the importance of and how to teach a children's Bible class. Providing a teacher's activity bag to each interested lady at the conclusion of those lessons would be a wonderful bonus.
